■ Latest news

In April this year we had our 6th edition of the Youth Encounter with Christ. This time we had no financial support so we got busy raising the money locally and, with a lot of hard work, managed to do so. One of the events we held was an international dinner. In the diocese we have many people from English-speaking countries such as Barbados, British Guyana and Nigeria. We decided to organise a dinner where we would share some of the delicacies from these different countries. We also had a few regional dishes from Pará, such as manicoba, an indigenous dish made from the leaves of the cassava plant – which are poisonous. In order to take out the poison the leaves are cooked for seven days, when they become a pulp and are served with pork and spicy sausage. The indigenous would leave the pulp to cook on special occasions as they went off to hunt and when they came back they would cook their catch in this pulp. Today it is a typical dish for special days such as Cirio de Nazare (procession for Our Lady of Nazareth - the most popular religious festival in Latin America). The mixture of cultures is interesting and is very apparent in what we eat. I was wondering which English dish to cook for the dinner, then remembered that one of the most popular dishes in England is chicken tikka massala, so I made that. I also made a trifle for 100 people! Alícia Payne is from British Guyana but from Chinese decent, so she prepared chow mein - so it was quite an international experience.


